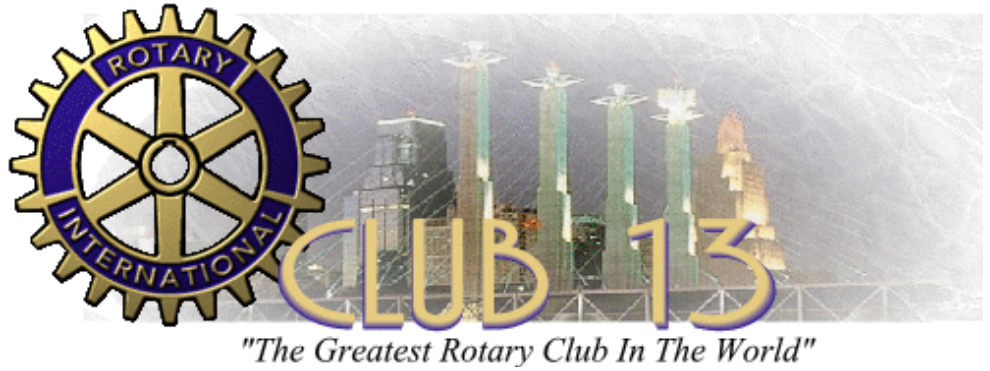

"A NEW DAY FOR KANSAS CITY"

KAY BARNES, MAYOR, CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI



The leadership of Mayor Kay Barnes has generated much good news in recent months. She spearheaded the campaign for voter approval of funding for KC's new downtown arena at 14th and Grand and led the efforts to bring H & R Block's world headquarters to 13th and Main.

In addition, the Cordish Co. has come to develop the Kansas City Live! District from Grand to Baltimore, 13th to Truman Road. By the summer of 2006, she predicts, the Downtown Loop will have been transformed into a thriving entertainment, retail and restaurant venue for people throughout the Midwest.

The city's first woman mayor began her political career in 1974, when she became one of two women on the Jackson County Legislature. In 1978 she was elected to a four-year term on the City Council.

My hat's off to Ray Klingingsmith for putting a very personal face on the grand work of the Rotary International Foundation. If you missed Thursday, then you missed a dandy presentation that made you feel personally involved in the foundation's work, from South Africa to Togo to Ethiopia to India to Australia.

Ray often referred to the "magic of Rotary," the kind of magic that has grown KC's 1917 contribution of \$26.50 into a \$ 600,000,000 foundation.

Ray started our personal foundation tour by relating his own experiences as a Rotary Scholar at the University of Cape town, South Africa. And he wove a web from there connecting to Polio Plus in India with a goal of eradicating polio worldwide. He told us the story of Erica, a Rotary Scholar sponsored by his home club. While she was in South Africa as a student she not

only helped restore water to a village but her efforts also led to a partnership between the Kirksville, MO club and a South African club enabling ongoing food distribution in that same village.

Ray congratulated **Dick Burnett** on being the "father" of the Rotary Centers for International Understanding. Now there are seven of the "Peace Centers" at universities around the globe.

Ray's storytelling skills took us along on a visit to a village in Ethiopia where the primitive life style hasn't changed for hundreds of years. Even so, he was within sight of a modern international airport with jets taking off and landing. He closed by saying the "magic of Rotary" is no more than Rotarians becoming involved with their time, talent and treasure to make a difference in the world.

"Smooth Talkin' " District Governor **John Miller** introduced **Ray**. **John** also worked in an introduction for six past district governors who were present: Carl Chinnery, Larry Lunsford, Jerry Wilford, **Jim Porter**, **Bill Nofsinger** and **Dick Burnett**.

President **Sally Bibb** called us to order and guided us through the Pledge of Allegiance. **Ann Johnson** encouraged a respite from election madness sharing St. Francis "Serenity Prayer." **Mike Hennessy** welcomed our visitor and guests.

The enthusiastic musical debut of **Gerald Lee**, accompanied by **Carl Bolte's** piano styling, brought November birthday greetings to Rotarians and inspired the rest of us through a rousing "This Is My Country."

Bill Buckner brought us up to date on next summer's International Youth Exchange program with Rotary districts in Germany, France and Sweden. 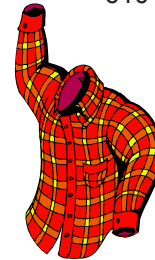

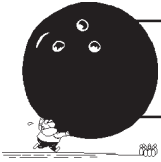
