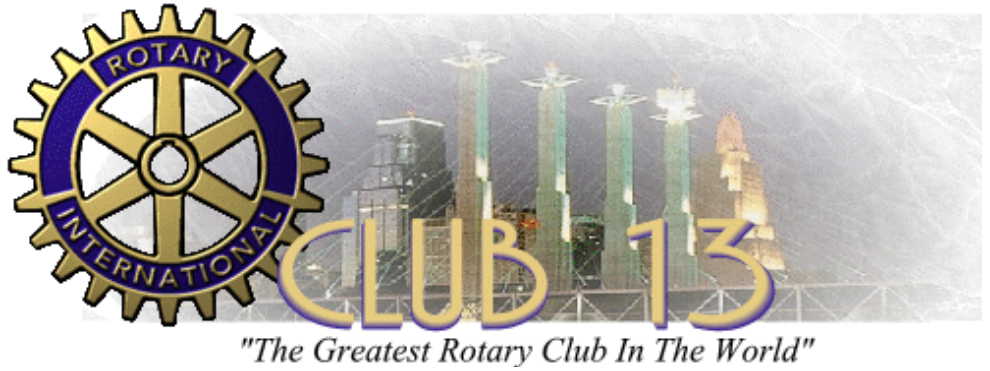
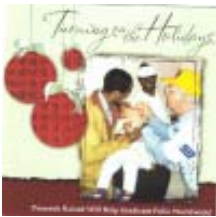

"THE LINDA HALL LIBRARY: KANSAS CITY'S HIDDEN GEM" BRUCE BRADLEY, LIBRARIAN FOR SPECIAL COLLECTIONS



As librarian for the history of science at the Linda Hall Library, Bruce Bradley serves as curator for the library's special collection of rare books on the history of science and technology. Responsibilities include administration of an active program of rare book acquisitions, with contacts in United States, Canada and Europe.

Daily contacts with researchers for reference and research assistance from around the world offer a unique opportunity to share the resources of the Linda Hall Library worldwide. Bradley is also responsible for

the library's exhibition program of rare books.

He has also held several other concurrent responsibilities at the library, including special operations officer for development, head of access services and acting director. Before coming to the Linda Hall Library in 1979, he was librarian at Avila College in Kansas City.

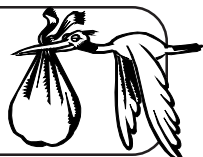


Bowling
