Long active in Kansas City politics and civic affairs, Jack Craft presently serves as vice chair for the Bistate II Initiative and on the executive committee and board of the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce.

Craft has also served as chairman of the Public Improvements Advisory Committee of Kansas City and the Kansas City Port Authority. In 1996, he was chairman of the Missouri Task Force for the Bistate Initiative and Missouri chairman and treasure of Yes on Union Station.

Formerly an assistant Missouri attorney general and assistant U.S. attorney for the Western District of Missouri, in 1987 Craft founded Craft Fridkin & Rhyne, L.L.C., a law firm specializing in business and regulatory matters. That firm was merged in January with Lathrop & Gage L.C., where he is chairman of the government relations practice.

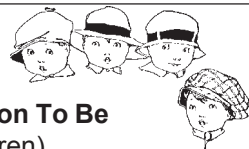

Leon A. "Lee" Triggs, a member of Club 13 since 1955, died at St. Luke's Hospital on Saturday, August 21, 2004. His lifelong occupation was with Leon A. Triggs & Associates Insurance Agency, a firm founded by his father, Leon A. Triggs, Sr. Lee retired from active duty at Triggs & Associates on Jan. 1, 1991.

Lee was a member of the Kansas Insurance Agents Association and the National Association.

Lee served this club as secretary-treasurer in 1979-80. Lee also bowled in the Rotary league for many seasons.
