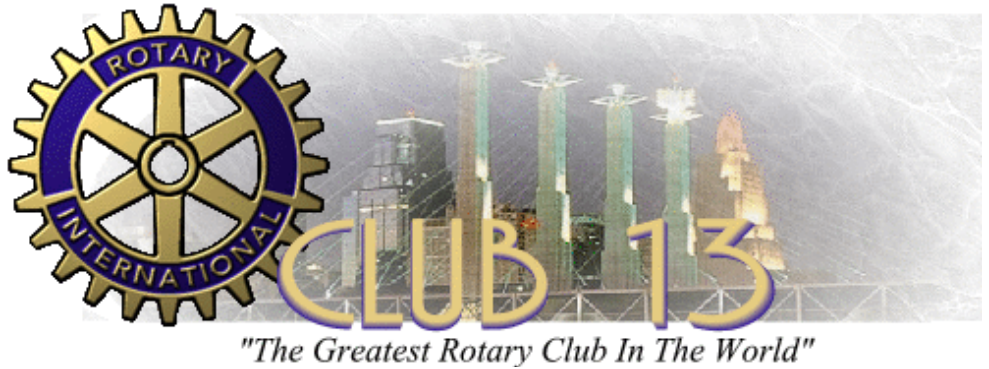

"LAUNCHING ROTARY'S SECOND CENTURY" JERRY W. VENTERS, DISTRICT GOVERNOR 6040



As a teenager Jerry Venters had two career goals - law and journalism. He has been fortunate to enjoy a rewarding career in each. He received journalism degree from the University of Missouri and was a reporter for the St. Louis Post-Dispatch from 1965-73. He returned to MU in 1973 to go to law school and graduated in 1976.

From 1976-98, Venters practiced law in Jefferson City, specializing in commercial and bankruptcy law. In February 1999, he was appointed as a U.S. bankruptcy judge, a position he now holds in Kansas City.

Venters joined the Rotary Club of Jefferson City West in 1989 and held several club offices. He was president in 1997-98 and Rotarian of the Year in 1998. He joined the Plaza Club in 1989, where his wife, Cassy, is also a member.

New President **Tom Terry** got our new Rotary year off to a great start, it also being his birthday, as **Harlan Stamper** led "Happy Birthday" to July celebrants, followed with an enthusiastic, post July 4, "America the Beautiful" with Captain **Carl** on the piano. **Bill Greiner** gave a timely prayer for the victims of the morning terrorist attacks in London and pleaded for guidance to world leaders in combatting this evil.

Andy Beyer introduced our visitors.

Pres. **Tom** reminded us to remember **Jerry Rosenbloom** and **Howard Adrian** with get-well cards.

A new way of introducing new members was instigated by having sponsors introduce each at the podium: **Bob Edwardson** sponsored **Ted Bertram**; **Bill Conklin** by **Tom Kirkwood**; **Dan Pearson** by **Carl DiCapo**; and **Walter "Chip" Dickey**

by **Jack Darrow**. **Leslie Dunn** presided at the indoctrination before lunch.

President **Tom**, introducing our speaker, related a dream/nightmare he had a few nights ago before his first meeting today: the P.A. system didn't work; he lost the agenda; and he couldn't adjourn the meeting until 2:30 p.m. (We've all had these, Tom.)

Bryan Burrough, a former reporter for *The Wall Street Journal* and author of several books, gave a quick rundown on the rampant crime in the '20s and '30s here in the midwest, and how it prompted Congress to give the FBI arms and authority to combat crime.

Criminals pretty much had their way, as there was no organized anti-crime force to deter them, and Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas were the operating arena for the likes of Ma Barker, Bonnie and Clyde, Pretty Boy Floyd, Dillinger and Machine Gun Kelly. Burrough stated that the Union Station Massacre was the event that caused Congress to empower the FBI to act, and after a few mishaps, bring an end, within a few months in 1934, to the above criminals.

Burrough credits his MU journalism education and breaking in at *The Wall Street Journal* as keys to his success. His book, "Public Enemies, America's Greatest Crime Wave and Birth of the FBI," is available at Rainy Day Bookstore.

We are eager to hear about her experiences, as well as the adventures of the three other District 6040 girls abroad this summer under the program. These other girls are Louise Allen and Katherine Bliss from Liberty, who are now in Chateauroux and Autun, respectively, in France, and Christine McCormick of Kirksville now in Nordrhein-Westfalen, Germany.
