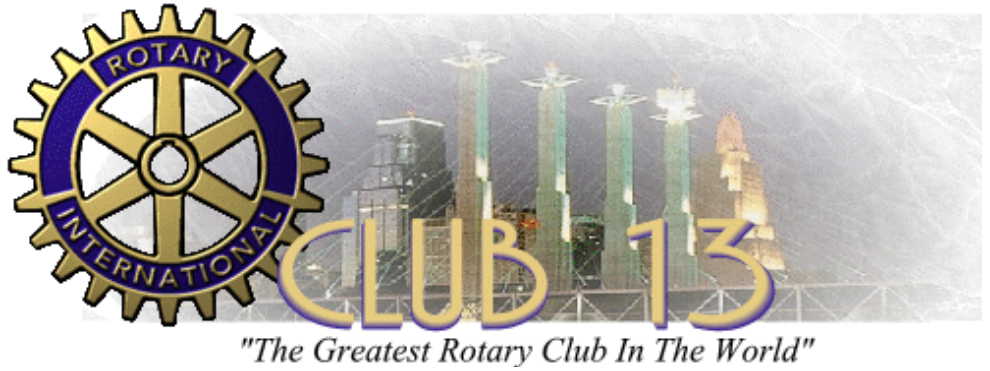

"THE HONORABLE RASTISLAV KACER" Ambassador of the Slovak Republic



Rastislav Kacer arrived in Washington, D.C. in 2003 from his prior post as State Secretary (Deputy Minister) of Defense of the Slovak Republic, which he had held since February 2001. His main task at the Ministry of Defense was his country's accession process to NATO, which is being successfully concluded after Slovakia's invitation at the Prague Summit in the fall of 2003.

Kacer worked at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 1992-2001. From 1994-98 he was posted at the Slovak Mission to NATO in Brussels. In 1999 he was made

Director General of the Division of International Organizations and Security Policy at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He also served as Head of the Analysis Unit in the Department of Analysis and Planning and Director of the Department of Analysis and Planning.

In Memoriam

Rod J. Cyr
 1924-2005



Roderick J. "Rod" Cyr, a member of Club 13 since 1975, died at his home on May 22, 2005.

In addition to his participation in Club 13, **Rod** was active in many civic activities, including being an honorary director of the executive board of Rockhurst University from 1992 to 2004. He also served on the board of directors of St. Joseph's Health Center, Lyric Opera and the Loretto Academy.

Rod worked for Western Fireproofing Co., which he purchased in 1963 and sold in 1987. In 1988 he became President of the United Kansas Bank which later merged with Mark Twain Bank and became US Bank. **Rod** remained on their staff as vice chairman.

Rod was a Paul Harris Fellow.

Survivors include his daughters, Cathy Nigro and Suzanne Whitmer; his three sisters, Ann Metz, Lorraine MacElhone and Germaine Skoglund; and three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

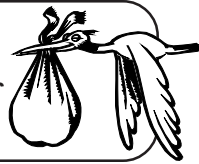
