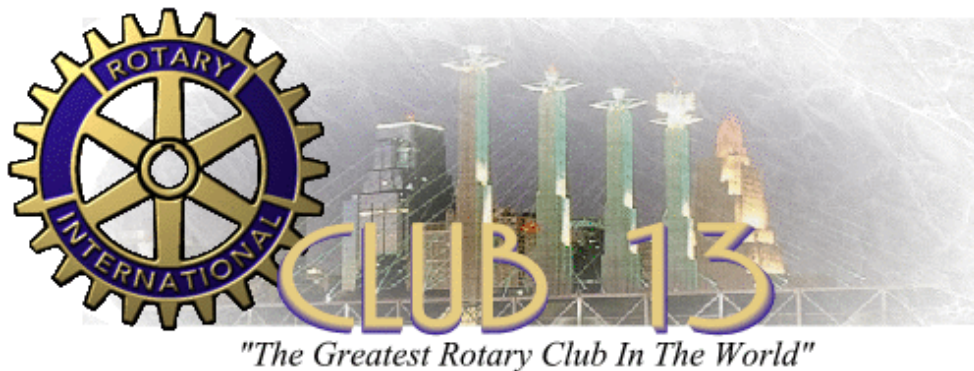

## CARL D. PETERSON PRESIDENT/GM/CEO, KANSAS CITY CHIEFS



Entertaining his 17th season as the Chiefs' top executive, Carl Peterson is regarded as the person most responsible for the club's return to prominence on and off the field since arriving in 1988.

For the third time in his career, Peterson has joined forces with Dick Vermeil and current VP of Football Operations Lynn Stiles to form a true gridiron trinity. The three were together for UCLA's 1976 Rose Bowl championship, as well as the Philadelphia Eagles' berth in Super Bowl XV in 1981.

Under Peterson's continued guidance, the Chiefs maintain one of the strongest seasons ticket bases of any pro sports team, boasting individual season-ticket accounts from 48 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and Canada. The Chiefs consistently fill the NFL's third-largest stadium, despite operating in the fifth-smallest market.

“Streamlining” was a key word as Gov. Kathleen Sebelius graced our podium last Thursday bringing a message of efficiency in Kansas government while at the same time being responsive to the three basic desires of state residents. Her stated goal is not to cut services but to cut the costs of delivering those services.

As she travels, Governor Sebelius says she is struck by the similarity in values and issues voiced throughout the state. She cites excellence in education, health care and jobs as the issues that top the list.

She told us that “great education” is the “best economic development tool” for the state. “Increased investment” (aka more cash) available this year to schools in Kansas is just a starting point. Sebelius called for increased accountability from the schools to ensure resources are put to good use. A state-wide audit is being launched to

look at all 302 school districts.

Sebelius says the State of Kansas can’t solve all health care problems but it can help reduce health delivery costs by streamlining administrative requirements such as providing uniform billing forms and systems.

The governor reported that Kansas has recorded 17 straight months of job growth. She proudly pointed to a new bio science initiative in NE Kansas and to the recently completed negotiations settling the future of the former Sunflower ammunition plant lands. She reached out to Jackson countians with assurance that she has plans for a NASCAR Hall of Fame and not a Chiefs stadium on her drawing board. Acknowledging Club 13 as a “bi-state” club, the governor wants Missouri and Kansas to encourage bi-state development along a transparent state line.

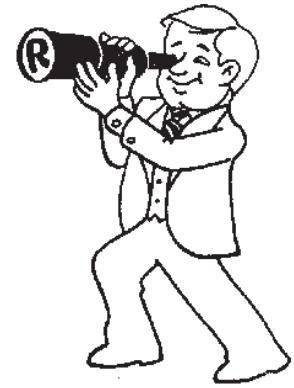
In her third year as governor, Sebelius says her four jobs are: being the “designated bragger” for Kansas; being a peacemaker; being a skilled manager; and being a wife and mother. President **Tom Terry** handled the introduction of the Governor.

**Ted Dalberg** opened our meeting leading us in singing “America the Beautiful.” Thank you to Signa Wittwer for ably filling in for our wandering pianist. **Diane Scott** shared the poem, “A Prayer for a Friend,” written by Rhoda-Katie Hanan. President **Tom** said **Tanja Heinen** deserved combat pay as she efficiently introduced a large number of guests and visitors. **Bill Poquette** (editor of this newsletter) and **Scott Wagner** both received the highly coveted and expensive “blue bracelet” in recognition of their “Service Above Self.”

From the list she handed out, it appears that **Susan Bell**, **Steve Corbin** and **Charles Tryban** have recruited about three score and ten of their Rotary friends to hit the lanes this fall.

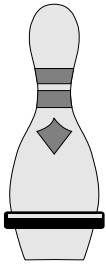
