"THE TRUE STORY OF THE CIA'S WAR ON TERRORISTS" ROBERT BAER, AUTHOR AND FORMER CIA AGENT



Three years after the start of the Iraq war, Robert Baer asks: Did the U.S. go to war with the wrong country? In recent weeks, Iran's defiance of U.N Security Council sanctions against uranium enrichment and the insistence of its president, Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, to pursue nuclear technology have brought international relations with this highly volatile country to a boiling point.

Baer spent 20 years running agents from inside the CIA's Directorate of Operations, operating against Hizballah, Al-Qaeda, and other terrorist organizations, and "was considered perhaps the best on-the-ground field officer in the Middle East," according to Seymour M. Hersh writing in *The New Yorker*.

Baer's memoir, *See No Evil*, was a *New York Times* bestseller and inspired the movie "Syriana" starring George Clooney. He lives in Colorado.

What a great program, informative, direct and very well presented. **Diane Scott** introduced her boss, Mark Ziemann, editor of *The Kansas City Star*.

Before I tell you of the content of his speech, let me say that sadly President **Tom** is down to 28 days, 6 hours and 30 minutes. It has been a good trip. **Dodie Jacobi, Marcia Bolton** and **Nick Scielzo** and my brother **Carl** handled the opening ceremonies with skill and aplomb.

The main thrust of Ziemann's speech was why we are where we are and what we are doing to stay here and why we will be better. *The Star* has been purchased by the McClatchy company of Sacramento, Calif. Ever since Ben Franklin, people have been predicting the demise of the morning newspaper. Well, it is not going to happen. Even today, 54% of America reads a paper and 19% of young people. This is surprising to me. The reasons newspapers are growing: They are 1) rare — not many are left; 2) valuable — they have experience on their side; 3) hard to imitate — cheap to deliver the news; 4. benefitting from the Internet.

To stay in business they are doing several things: increasing efficiency, exploiting new technology and using the Internet to their advantage.

On Monday (June 5), *The Star* will unveil its NEW newspaper. It will have color, more stories, more energy and be a better newspaper. With its new presses it will fine tune all of the production problems and put out an excellent product.

Mark answered one very basic question when someone from the audience asked "Why don't we have more ...?" "We can give you more of that item every day" he said, "but now we have to ask ourselves another question — 'How much is enough?'" I thought it was a very interesting program and we are grateful to **Diane Scott** for bringing Mark to Rotary.

One speech that needed to be said was THANKYOU KANSASCITYSTAR FOR 18 YEARS OF KANSAS CITY DAY. Because of its generosity, we have enriched our Youth Camp Foundation by a million and one half dollars. None of this would have ever come about had it not been for this fine newspaper. Thank you - Thank you - Thank you. **EXTRA! EXTRA! READ ALL ABOUT IT.**

2006 Greater KC Golf Classic

The Senior Tour is coming back and we are running the parking lots again this year. In 2005 156 volunteers raised over \$14,000 for our Youth Camp in the worst weather week (13 inches of rain with 2 days of tournament play cancelled) in Senior tour history.

For 2006 the tournament week has been changed to a much drier time, Monday June 26 to Sunday July 2. With good weather we should be able to raise over \$25,000. We have learned from last year's experience and this year we only need 126 volunteers.

That means that each volunteer opportunity will mean a \$200 contribution to our Youth Camp. After the June 1 meeting only 33 volunteer shift opportunities are left. We have no early morning shifts available. Midday and/or afternoon shifts are available every day. **Our greatest needs are Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.**

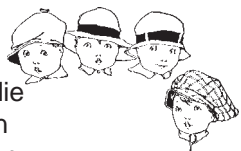

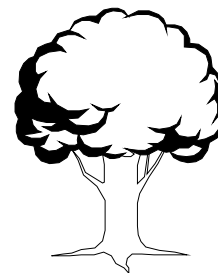
