"2006 ECONOMIC OUTLOOK" THOMAS HOENIG, PRESIDENT, FEDERAL RESERVE BANK



Thomas M. Hoenig is president and chief executive officer of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City. He is also a member of the Federal Reserve System's Open Market Committee, the key body with authority over monetary policy.

Hoenig received his doctorate in Economics from Iowa State University. He joined the Federal Reserve Bank in 1973 as an economist and assumed the role of president on Oct. 1, 1991. Hoenig directs Federal Reserve activities in the seven-state Tenth Federal Reserve District — an area that includes Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Wyoming, the northern half of New Mexico and the western third of Missouri.

Hoenig is a member of the board of trustees of the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation. He serves on the boards of directors of Benedictine College, Atchison, KS, and the Midwest Research Institute and Union Station, Kansas City, MO.

"It's about passion and really not about money." That message, offered by Laura McKnight, is encouragement for every one of us to be part of improving the quality of life in KC. As president and CEO of the Greater Kansas City Community Foundation, she manages the fifth-largest community foundation in the U.S. including over \$1 billion in assets. Each year the G.K.C.C.F. and its donors grant approximately \$100 million to charitable and community causes.

McKnight named three goals for the foundation: Connecting donors with opportunities, providing leadership in the community and increasing giving. She gave an example of how one woman, with little money but a passion for a charity, is now raising \$500,000 annually for the charity she loves.

She pointed to the foundation's efforts to develop a "world class research university" here in KC. On the fund raising front she outlined efforts to identify donors, the foundation's flexibility and the development of "regional connections."

On this St. Patrick's Day eve, **Bob Lager** treated us to a superb rendition of *Danny Boy*. Then he teamed with **Carl Bolte** on the 88's leading us in song.

Wayne Stallard offered our invocation, sharing a prayer written by Peter Marshall. **Don Stebbins** introduced our guests and visiting Rotarians. President **Tom Terry** rang the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance and sadly noted the death of Past President **Charlie Schleicher**.

Service Above Self recognition went to **Bob Lager** and to **Ann Johnson**, who was the first Rotarian ever to be receive the blue wrist band while wearing a bumble bee costume.

The purpose of the bee-utiful getup was to join **Mary Kingsley** in announcing the Rotary Grand Spell-Off and Club 13's support of Literacy Kansas City's Spelling Bee. Music Party was a joyful (?) note!

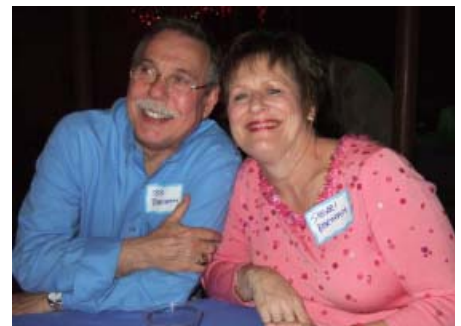

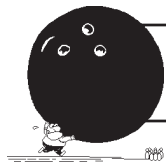
