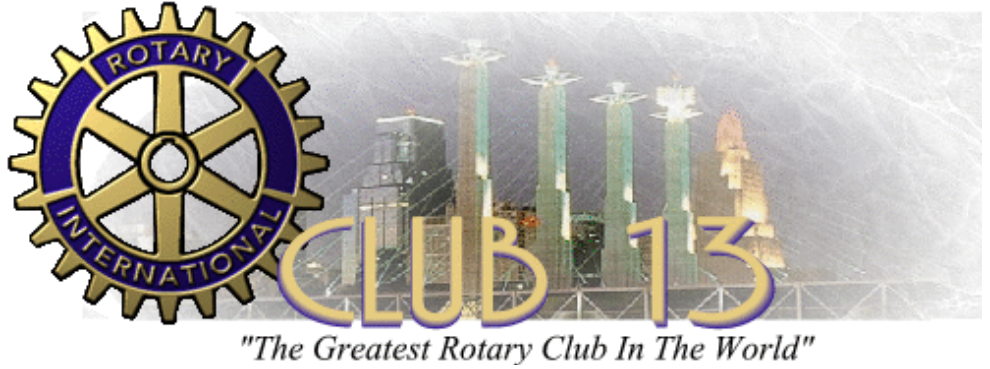

Kemper has also been involved in numerous civic, educational and historic commissions and boards.
