Right off the bat, last Thursday's speaker grabbed my attention and solidified his credentials as a naturalist when he correctly identified the Jayhawk as a "prairie chicken on steroids." Seriously, Doug Ladd, director of conservation science for the Missouri chapter of the Nature Conservancy, knows his topic after 25 years of conservation research, planning, restoration and natural area management.

Ladd challenged common thinking that economic concerns and conservation concerns are opposing views. He told us the reality is we face the same balancing challenge as did the native Indians who lived here hundreds of years ago: meeting the needs of human beings while maintaining the sustainability of natural resources. It was encouraging to hear him say we are "only a step away from healthy natural resources."

Ladd compared conservationists to Rotarians in that both think about the future and seek the greater good. He called for us to take long-term versus

short-term views when thinking about the economic sense of managing out natural resources. He pointed to upstate New York as an example where "visionaries" set aside land as watersheds and aquifers so the bustling metropolitan centers have adequate water supplies for today and the future.

He gave us examples ranging from the Current River Valley in the southeastern Ozarks to the Tall Grass Prairie where the Nature Conservancy is working to sustain our natural resources while keeping economic realities in focus.

In reshaping our thinking Ladd said we need to "get away from the notion that conservation is apart from our daily lives." He continued that "indeed it is a part of the fabric of our lives." It doesn't matter if your interest in conservancy stems from personal, moral, aesthetic or practical reasons, we have to craft solutions that work for both sides.

Ladd was introduced to Club 13 by his long-time friend, **Jan Canterbury**.

An outstanding group of fine Tyrotarians greeted us at the door. This summer seems to be flying by and it was time for **Charlie Huffman** and **Carl Bolte** to help us celebrate August birthdays in song. They followed with a rousing rendition of "My Country 'tis of Thee." President **Chuck Vogt** led our Pledge of Allegiance.

As part of her invocation **Tanja Heinen** asked that we would all have a commitment to the 4 Way Test. **Nancy DuVall** introduced our guests and a repeat visiting Rotarian from Upper Sandusky, Ohio. **Dan Doty** introduced Gene McCaley, who is visiting CUM gaining insight for establishing the first rescue mission in Israel.

It was good to have **Don Patterson** back with us after his recent journey through recovery bay. **Dick Brown**, **Don Seifert** and **Jim Shultz** are still dealing with health concerns. Keep them in your prayers and thoughts.

**Bill Robinson** returned from his annual visit to the Girl Scout sessions at the Youth Camp and presented a handful of banners from Rotary clubs across the country. Prez **Chuck "Tall Dude" Vogt** reminded us of the Aug. 30 Annual Family Picnic, Sept. 13 Guest Day and the Annual Golf Classic on Sept. 24.
