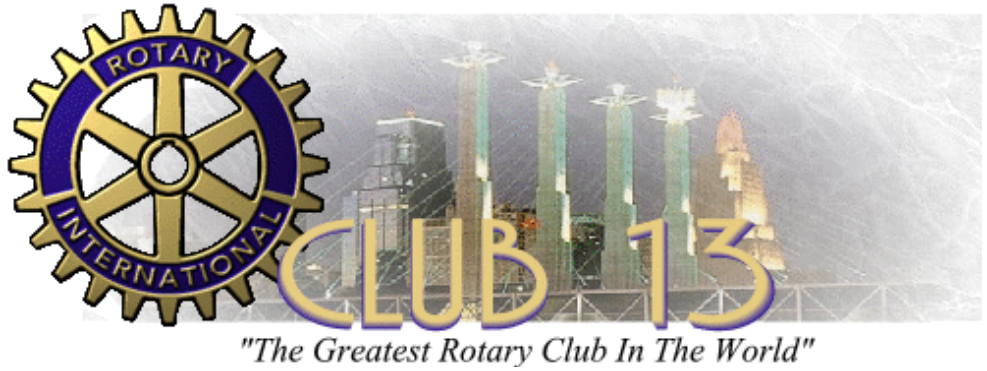

MARY KELLER, E.D., MILITARY CHILD EDUCATION COALITION

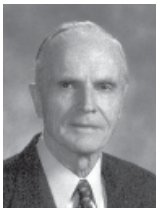

She was one of the founders of the Military Child Education Coalition, a national non-profit organization serving as an advocate for military children as they transition between school systems.

Having served as an administrator in two other Texas school systems, Mary came to Central Texas in 1992 and served eight years as assistant superintendent and area superintendent for education services for the Killeen Independent School District. Her experience in working with military families began in the KISD as that school community includes Fort Hood, Texas.

Mary has authored several publications, including "The Military Child: Mobility and Education" for Phi Delta Kappa.

High School Scholarship Applications Due April 23

Rotary District 6040 will award 12-14 scholarships to deserving seniors with good records and scores. The application form and instructions can be downloaded from Club 13's website, www.rotary13.org. Applications and supporting information must be sent to the Club 13 Rotary office, 1219 Wyandotte St., Kansas City, MO 64105-1621 no later than April 23. Each club will select the best applications it receives and send them to a district scholarship committee, which will make the final selections.

The criteria for selection are: academic achievement (class rank) - 15%; college entrance exam (ACT/SAT) - 10%; school and community leadership and service activities - 30%; knowledge of Rotary and Service Above Self - 20%; financial need - 20%; and merit/extenuating circumstance - 5%.

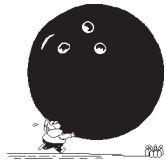
