This week will be the first Chiefs home opener ever, without Chiefs founder **Lamar Hunt**. When he died last year Club 13 lost a good friend and honorary member. That relationship has now been extended as President **Chuck Vogt** announced last Thursday the board of directors has bestowed honorary membership on **Clark Hunt**.

KC sports broadcaster Bill Grigsby, The self proclaimed "voice of adversity", worked the crowd of Club 13 Rotarians like a seasoned pro warming us up for the main event. It's always enjoyable to hear "Griggs" but we were primed to hear a message of gridiron hope and optimism from the new Chiefs Chairman **Clark Hunt**.

Chiefs play by play announcer Mitch Holtus told us that we would all be encouraged by the character of the man who is the new flag bearer for the Chiefs. Holtus also told us it was "a

Hunt did not disappoint as he said he indeed saw improvement in the 2007 Chiefs between the first two weeks of the young season. He said he was excited about a good draft this year and that he agrees with Coach Herm Edwards philosophy of building a team through the draft. He told us that he was also excited that they have now broken ground on the "new Arrowhead" and asked us to put up with "dust and dirt" for the next three years of refurbishment.

Hunt stated his goals for the Chiefs: Maintaining and enhancing the fan experience; Staying involved with the community; and music to our ears, Winning the Lamar Hunt trophy.

On arrival for our annual pilgrimage to Arrowhead we were welcomed by a special group of "regular greeters". The a cappella duet of **Charlie Huffman** and first assistant vocalist **Carl Bolte** led us "loud and proud" in singing. President **Chuck** took the lead in the Pledge of Allegiance and **Bill Buckner** shared the West Point Cadet Prayer as our invocation.

Jerry Swords handled the introduction of 29 guests "en masse" but gave singular attention to visiting Rotarian Alex Petrovic III from Overland Park and to special guest, Chiefs Ring of Honor member Curtis McClinton.

We missed **Vince Rawson**, the only current resident of Recovery Bay who is still on the mend at St. Luke's Hospital.

President **Chuck** congratulated Lori Hewitt, **Paula Willett** and the Camp Enterprise team for another successful event last weekend. And without missing a beat he reminded us that 200 volunteers are needed for the Waddell and Reed Marathon one month from today.

He also honored Immediate Past President **Rick Halterman** by presenting him with a highly coveted hardbound book of *The Buzz Saw* commemorating his presidential year. **Rick**, "the un-pesky past president" and I look forward to seeing you next Thursday.
