It will be one of our most unique meetings ever, complete with Civil War re-enactors and color guards, plus a big screen video presentation of a Civil War battle.

Featured luncheon speakers will be: 1) Col. Terry L. Crowder, Commander Division Cavalry Brigade, Commander First Federal Division and Chief of Cavalry 10th Missouri Division; a renowned Civil War historian and a veteran of more than 250 re-enactments from coast to coast; and 2) Brig. Gen. Jack King, Division Commander Confederate, Second Division.
