Can it be that the Rotarian seated next to you at lunch last Thursday is one of America's "weapons" in the war on terrorism? That was the point of Supervisory Special FBI Agent Deborah Stafford, who has spent the last two decades specializing in counter terrorism work. Using a picture of everyone's favorite Martian, "Uncle Martin," she urged us to "keep our antennas up" because everyone's vigilance is key to helping the counter terrorism folks keep us safe.

It was sobering as she deftly listed almost a dozen foiled acts of international terrorism just since May of this year. Yet, we see just the tip of the iceberg because 80-some percent of their work is classified secret.

She demonstrated the changing face of terrorism as it ranges from the suicide bombers in the Middle East to educated professionals operating in

loosely affiliated cells around the world. Stafford reported on FBI-monitored, U.S.-based terrorist activities such as fund raising, recruiting and training.

She told us that terrorist leaders today are technologically astute and have developed methods of communications that are difficult to detect and track. That's why our job to be aware and to report suspicious activities is important. It shouldn't take a camel in the parking lot at KCI to make us suspicious.

Past President **Jerry Moeller** introduced Deborah Stafford to us and Past President Tom Terry introduced three new Club 13 Rotarians, **Barbara Dolci, Kyle Roehler** and **Jeff Van Horn**. Completing a trifecta of past presidents, **John Miller** introduced John Gillespie from the UK who was leading Rotarians from District 1080 in England on a Friendship Exchange.

They were preceded at the podium by current President **Chuck Vogt** commending **Dick Retrum** and the Entertainment Committee for a job well done with last week's Family Picnic. Finally getting his own 60 seconds at the podium, Prez **Chuck** also urged participation in the Waddell & Reed Marathon in late October.
